July 13 - Thursday - Day 5: Florence - Day at Leisure





Florence is the capital city of the <u>Italian region</u> of <u>Tuscany</u>. It is the most populous city in Tuscany, with 383,084 inhabitants in 2013, and over 1,520,000 in its metropolitan area.

Florence was a centre of <u>medieval European</u> trade and finance and one of the wealthiest cities of that era. It is considered the birthplace of the <u>Renaissance</u>, and has been called "the <u>Athens</u> of the <u>Middle Ages</u>". A turbulent political history includes periods of rule by the powerful <u>Medici</u> family and numerous religious and republican revolutions. From 1865 to 1871 the city was the capital of the recently established <u>Kingdom of Italy</u>. The <u>Florentine dialect</u> forms the base of <u>Standard Italian</u> and it became the language of culture throughout Italy due to the prestige of the masterpieces by <u>Dante Alighieri</u>, <u>Petrarch</u>, <u>Giovanni</u> <u>Boccaccio</u>, <u>Niccolò Machiavelli</u> and <u>Francesco Guicciardini</u>.

The city attracts millions of tourists each year, and the <u>Historic Centre of</u> <u>Florence</u> was declared a <u>World Heritage Site</u> by UNESCO in 1982. The city is noted for its culture, <u>Renaissance art and architecture</u> and monuments. The city also contains numerous museums and art galleries, such as the <u>Uffizi Gallery</u> and the <u>Palazzo Pitti</u>, and still exerts an influence in the fields of art, culture and politics. Due to Florence's artistic and architectural heritage, it has been ranked by <u>Forbes</u> as one of the most beautiful cities in the world.

Florence is an important city in <u>Italian fashion</u>, being ranked in the top 15 <u>fashion capitals</u> of the world; furthermore, it is a major national economic centre, as well as a tourist and industrial hub. In 2008, the city had the 17th highest average income in <u>Italy</u>.

July 15 - Saturday - Day 7: VENICE ISLAND - Day at Leisure



Venice is a city in northeastern <u>Italy</u> and the capital of the <u>Veneto region</u>. It is situated across a group of 118 small islands that are separated by canals and linked by bridges, of which there are 400. The islands are located in the shallow <u>Venetian Lagoon</u>, an enclosed bay that lies between the mouths of the <u>Po</u> and the <u>Piave</u> rivers (more exactly between the <u>Brenta</u> and the <u>Sile</u>). Parts of Venice are renowned for the beauty of their settings, their <u>architecture</u>, and artwork. The lagoon and a part of the city are listed as a <u>UNESCO World Heritage Site</u>.

In 2014, 264,579 people resided in <u>Comune</u> di Venezia, of whom around 55,000 live in the historic city of Venice (Centro storico). Together with <u>Padua</u> and <u>Treviso</u>, the city is included in the <u>Padua-Treviso-Venice Metropolitan Area</u> (PATREVE), with a total population of 2.6 million. PATREVE is only a statistical metropolitan area.

The name is derived from the ancient <u>Veneti</u> people who inhabited the region by the 10th century BCE. The city was historically the capital of the <u>Republic of</u> <u>Venice</u>. Venice has been known as the "La Dominante," "Serenissima," "Queen of the <u>Adriatic</u>," "City of Water," "City of Masks," "City of Bridges," "The Floating City," and "City of Canals." The Republic of Venice was a major financial and maritime power during the <u>Middle Ages</u> and <u>Renaissance</u>, and a <u>staging area</u> for the <u>Crusades</u> and the <u>Battle of Lepanto</u>, as well as a very important center of commerce (especially silk, grain, and <u>spice</u>) and art in the 13th century up to the end of the 17th century. The <u>city-state</u> of Venice is considered to have been the first real international financial center which gradually emerged from the 9th century to its peak in the 14th century. This made Venice a wealthy city throughout most of its history.

It is also known for its several important artistic movements, especially the <u>Renaissance period</u>. After the <u>Napoleonic Wars</u> and the <u>Congress of Vienna</u>, the Republic was annexed by the <u>Austrian Empire</u>, until it became part of the <u>Kingdom of Italy</u> in 1866, following a referendum held as a result of the <u>Third</u> <u>Italian War of Independence</u>. Venice has played an important role in the history of symphonic and operatic music, and it is the birthplace of <u>Antonio Vivaldi</u>. Venice has been ranked the most beautiful city in the world as of 2016. The city is facing some major challenges, however, including financial difficulties, erosion, pollution, subsidence, an excessive number of tourists in peak periods and problems caused by oversized cruise ships sailing close to the banks of the historical city.
